2022 Subject Definitions



Month	(DPI/Print)	SET Subject Definitions (Open Definition below.*)
February	Print	Odd One Out: The image should contain several subjects/items that are the same or similar, but one of those subjects/items is distinctly different.
March	Print	Train:- Engine and/or carriages that run on a railroad track. (As opposed to say a camel train).
April	DPI	The Letter X: Image must show clearly the "X" shape. Can be several or singular, being made from any materials.
May	DPI	Rainbow: The natural "bow" in the sky.
June	Print	Farm Machinery: Mechanical devices, including tractors and implements, used in farming to save labour. Your examples may be currently in use or heritage pieces that have made an important contribution to our agricultural history and development.
July	Print	Child or children: Person/people from birth to teens.
August	DPI	Reflections: As in water/glass/metal or any surface that can reflect. Image to have at least part of the object being reflected in it.
September	DPI	Spiders: The image must contain a part or a whole spider as the main subject
October	DPI	Through The Window: An image that has a "central subject or scene", that is OBVIOUSLY taken from outside a window looking in, or inside a window looking out.
November	Print	A Row Of A Number Of Items: Items can be all the same or just be similar items in a row.
December	Prints & DPI	"End of Year" - Best Print - A and B Grade (Open and Set) Best DPI - A and B Grade (Open and Set)
Every Month	Print or DPI	*OPEN: Any subject treated pictorially. A pictorial treatment is one embodying the elements of good design, arrangement or composition and which reflect the interpretation of the photographer. (Australian Photographic Society)
