Month	(DPI/Print)	SET Subject Definitions (Open Definition below.*)
February	Print	ROADS TO RURAL – Fraser Coast Show Theme – No definition given. Open to personal interpretation
March	DPI	MY LOCAL AREA – Any subject limited to the Fraser Coast Regional Council area. Title of image to include location, ie Fraser Island, Burrum Heads, Maryborough, Woocoo, Tiaro etc
April	DPI	HUMOUR - (Tewantin Shield subject) - An image that creates a sense or feeling of being funny, amusing, or comical. Images can be single or composite images and can reflect a real-life situation or a created story
May	DPI	INTENTIONAL CAMERA MOVEMENT (ICM) - (Tewantin Shield subject) - In ICM, a camera is moved during the exposure for a creative or artistic effect. This causes the image points to move across the recording medium, producing an apparent streaking in the resulting image.
June	DPI	NATURE - Strictly in accordance with Australian Photographic Society definitions. (Visit APS website or follow this link) Nature Definition (a-p-s.org.au) [For further reading, visit Photographic Society of Qld web site www.psq.org.au Select JUDGES tab, then SUBJECT DEFINITIONS then JUDGES GUIDE TO NATURE.]
July	DPI	PERSON/PEOPLE - Includes head, head and shoulders or full body length study, candid photographs, formal portraits, environmental portraits or people in action
August	DPI	SHOW ME THE LIGHT - Light source (either artificial or natural) to be included
September	DPI	SHAPES AND/OR TEXTURES - Emphasis on the form of the image
October	DPI	NIGHT SKY - Night sky to be dominant element of image
November	DPI	ALL IN THE DETAIL - Close-up image showing fine detail – can include macro
December	DPI	"End of Year" Your best 3 DPI entries from 2023 in both Open and Set subject PLUS Peter Tierney Shield (Nature) images (A & B Grade combined)

***OPEN:** Any subject treated pictorially. A pictorial treatment is one embodying the elements of good design, arrangement or composition and which reflect the interpretation of the photographer. (Australian Photographic Society)
